Season Notes: The Cougars enjoyed their seventh straight season of 23 or more wins, finishing with a 24-6 record...John Kresse became the second fastest coach to 500 career wins in the Cougars' 69-56 win over Tennessee Tech in the championship game of the State Farm Good Neighbor/College of Charleston Classic on December 29th at the Kresse Arena...Jody Lumpkin and Jeff Bolton were named All-Conference by the league's coaches...Leighton Bowie was named to the league's First-Team All-Freshman team...Bowie's 360 points was the most by a Cougar freshman since joining Division ...Bowie and Lumpkin were named All-Tournament in the Southern Conference Tournament...Lumpkin was named the MVP of the State Farm Good Neighbor/ College of Charleston Classic while Bolton and Bowie were named to the All-Tournament Team...Lumpkin was named All-Southern Conference First-Team by the league's media...Lumpkin became the first Cougar to earn First-Team Verizon Academic All-American honors with a 3.93 grade point average...he was the only non-
